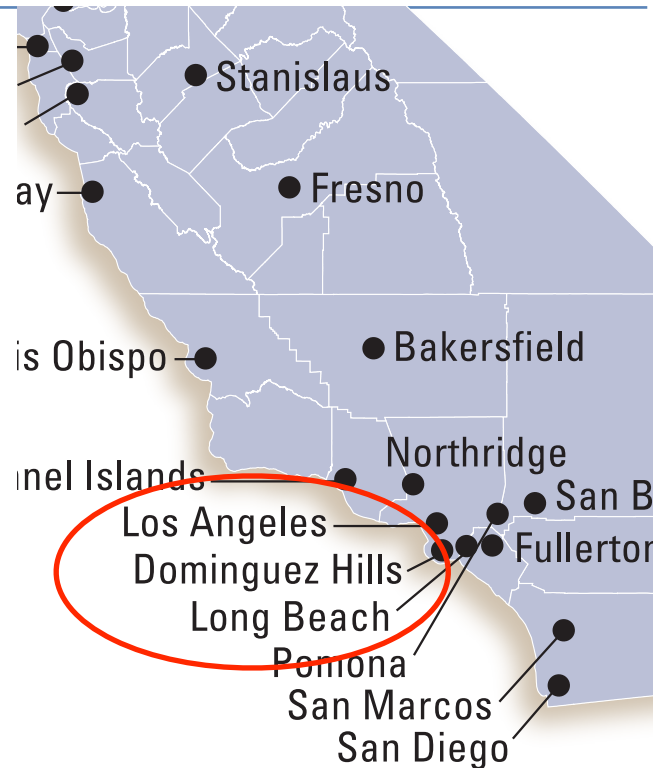

- ✓ The Cal State LA, CSU Dominguez Hills, and Cal State Long Beach campuses educate 70,000 students each year and 73% percent are students of color.
- ✓ Last year, the three LA area campuses graduated almost 15,000 students.
- ✓ Since 2000, these three campuses awarded more than 90,000 undergraduate and graduate degrees; 37 percent of the degrees went to Latino/as and African Americans.
- ✓ Gov. Schwarzenegger's proposed budget cut for the CSU system is bigger than the entire budgets of the LA and Dominguez Hills campuses combined.
- ✓ The proposed budget provides NO FUNDING for enrollment growth - LA area campuses will be forced to turn away eligible students.
- ✓ The economic impact of these three campuses generates \$108 million in tax revenues per year and sustains about 31,000 jobs.

**The CSU
is part of the
SOLUTION
to the state's
budget
crisis.**



✓ The CSU Sacramento and Chico campuses educate 46,000 students each year and 39% percent are students of color.

✓ Last year, these campuses graduated about 9,000 students.

✓ Since 2000, these three campuses awarded more than 61,000 undergraduate and graduate degrees; one in four degrees went to students of color.

✓ Gov. Schwarzenegger's proposed budget cut for the CSU system is more than one and a half times the size of the entire budget of the CSU Sacramento campus.

✓ The proposed budget provides NO FUNDING for enrollment growth - Central Valley campuses will be forced to turn away eligible students.

✓ The economic impact of these three campuses generates \$88 million in tax revenues per year and sustains about 27,000 jobs.

**The CSU
is part of the
SOLUTION
to the state's
budget
crisis.**



- ✓ The CSU Fresno, CSU Stanislaus, and CSU Bakersfield campuses educate 39,000 students each year and over half are students of color.
- ✓ Last year, these three Central Valley campuses graduated over 7,300 students.
- ✓ Since 2000, these three campuses awarded almost 47,000 undergraduate and graduate degrees; 38 percent of the degrees went to students of color.
- ✓ Gov. Schwarzenegger's proposed budget cut for the CSU system is equivalent to the entire budgets of the Fresno and Stanislaus campuses combined.
- ✓ The proposed budget provides NO FUNDING for enrollment growth - Central Valley campuses will be forced to turn away eligible students.
- ✓ The economic impact of these three campuses generates over \$68 million in tax revenues per year and sustains about 25,000 jobs.

**The CSU
is part of the
SOLUTION
to the state's
budget
crisis.**



- ✓ The CSU East Bay, San Francisco State, and San Jose State campuses educate over 75,000 students each year and 65% percent are students of color.
- ✓ Last year, the three Bay Area campuses graduated almost 17,000 students.
- ✓ Since 2000, these three campuses awarded about 110,000 undergraduate and graduate degrees; 44 percent of the degrees went to students of color.
- ✓ Gov. Schwarzenegger's proposed budget cut for the CSU system is more than twice the size of the CSU East Bay campus budget.
- ✓ The proposed budget provides NO FUNDING for enrollment growth - Bay Area campuses will be forced to turn away eligible students.
- ✓ The economic impact of these three campuses generates \$120 million in tax revenues per year and sustains about 29,000 jobs.
